I was recently given a copy of the 'Sheringham Official Guide 1973'. It has been a fascinating read and presented an opportunity to reflect upon the changes Sheringham and its surrounding areas have undergone over those 50 years.

In the 1973 guide there are pictures of a High Street where the cars now warrant 'classic car' status, and on the beach, there are canvas covered beach huts and numerous crab boats. The advertising in the guide reflects the changing needs of shoppers over the intervening years. Back in the day, East Coast Dairies offered 'Best Wishes for a Happy Holiday', and asked holiday makers to 'Mail Your Order' (and that won't be an email) for delivery of all their daily dairy requirements. Grocer and Provision Merchant,

Rusts Ltd. enticed the discerning shoppers by boasting 'home-smoked bacon and ham without equal'.

East Coast Dairies and Rusts Ltd. are no longer trading, but pleasingly others still are, such as Blyth and Wright, (then offering the inducement of Green Shield Stamps) and The Tyneside. The importance 50 years ago of tourism was evident with numerous adverts for hotels, guest houses, and other holiday accommodation.

Although changing with the times, what has remained constant are those features of Sheringham and surrounding areas that are treasured by residents and are a delight to visitors; beautiful beaches, a high street that is packed with choice, and some of the loveliest local scenery. This is supplemented by





attractions and events that bolster visitor numbers further such as the North Norfolk Railway, The Reef, a thoroughly modern leisure centre, and two museums filled with unique displays and celebrating a maritime history that is integral to the culture of Sheringham. The Sheringham Little Theatre provides a varied programme of events that not only entertains but feeds the soul. The hard-working volunteers of the Carnival Association organise a programme including an annual celebration of the town's Viking roots, a classic car show and the carnival week itself, with a nod to earlier times with sand sculptures on the beach as part of the summer fun.

If that's still not enough, Sheringham offers a splendid links golf course, two putting greens and nearby

Sheringham Park. And just like back then, perhaps take a walk up Beeston Bump and then head west to the far end of the promenade to the RNLI Lifeboat house.

This town, set between sea and pine, has much to offer residents and visitors alike, but I'll leave the last words to a former Councillor, Bryan Pigott who in the 1973 guide wrote, "Perhaps it is the spirit of warmth and generosity, contained in so delightful a setting that makes Sheringham so special". I could not have put it better myself.



"History with its flickering lamp stumbles along the trail of the past, trying to reconstruct its scenes, to revive its echoes, and kindle with pale gleams the passion of former days" (Winston Churchill)

The story of Sheringham stretches back over many centuries and is built around tales of ordinary folk who settled below the glacial moraine (the Cromer Ridge) left by the last Ice Age. The fossil record of the area has pointed to a marshland once inhabited by Mammoths, Wild Boar and Tigers to mention but a few species. David Barber, a local artist, has caught this period on the wall mural facing out to the North Sea, below the Two Lifeboats Hotel and The Crown Inn. Evidence in the form of fossilized bones has come out of the Cromer Forest Bed, with an almost complete skeleton of a Mammoth being recovered in 1990 from near West Runton and other bones from the cliffs below Beeston. Examples of flint Neolithic axes and arrow heads have been found on the beach with many good examples of the flint knappers work being seen in Sheringham and other Norfolk Museums. The area now

occupied by our town was wandered by nomadic hunter gatherers, following the herds of mammoths that gave food and skins for tents and clothing.

Research by local historians points to an early settlement being that of Scira's people. "ham" is an Anglo Saxon word for "small village", so we have the ham of Scira's people. Scira being of Danish origin possibly being linked with the Danes who came to settle in this part of East Anglia in approximately 750AD. Evidence of of the possibility of early Roman settlement was discovered in 1956, when a domestic kiln was discovered whilst excavating at the Upper Sheringham Council Depot. Greyware Roman pottery was recovered.

The Domesday Survey completed in 1086 is the first real mention of Sheringham . In the survey the settlement is recorded as Silingham and tells us that it was made up of a population of 28 (10 villagers, 12 smallholders, 5 slaves and 1 freeman.) The Survey also mentions a 4 acre meadow, woodlands, 100 pigs, a church and church lands.





The Lord of the Manor in 1086 was William of Ecouis. The mention of a church is probably that of the wooden structure that is thought to stand on the site prior to that of the current one of All Saints, Upper Sheringham being erected about 1400.

Records of the 17th and 18th centuries record storms that ripped into the cliffs taking chunks of land away (1789 and 1795). The storm of 1795 damaged land in front of the Crown Inn. Five years later in 1800 the Crown finally succumbed and crashed onto the beach.

In the wake of the Industrial Revolution 1760 – 1830 when we saw the transition from hand production methods to that of machines, new chemical manufacturing and iron production processes, the increased use of stream power, the development of steam power, the development of machine tools and the rise of the factory system. Although this had no immediate impact on Sheringham the foundations were being laid for a century of change and development in Sheringham, reflecting that which was happening in other parts of the country. In 1805 a House of Industry, Workhouse, was built in Upper Sheringham. This was followed in 1811 by the Enclosure Award.

Just over 200 years ago, in 1812, the owner of the Manor of Sheringham, Cook Flower, sold it to Abbot Upcher. So began the relationship of the Upcher Family with the folk of Sheringham. The family's benevolence and impact on the life and development of Sheringham had begun and would be transformational.

Railways had started to join towns and cities and the coast. From the 1840s a national railway network started to develop. It was on 16th June 1887 that the biggest factor in promoting growth in the town happened - the railway came to Sheringham. Now there was a direct line to London (3) hours 13 minutes) which in it's heyday had 64 trains a day passing in and out of the station. With this came the development of what had been arable land. The Upcher family sold blocks of land for building - The Sheringham Building Estate - which included what we now know as Augusta Street; The Boulevard; North and South Streets; St Nicholas Place and Links Road to mention some. At the same time the Upcher family gave land for the building of a church with St Peter's being completed in 1897 at a cost of £8000. This last decade of the 19th century saw rapid development and the changing from a small fishing village, just down the coast from fashionable Cromer, into a thriving seaside town in its own right!

In the early 20th century Sheringham attracted the wealthy and famous. People came to Sheringham for the benefits of the sea and coastal climate, as well as to visit friends and





join house parties arranged by those who had built holiday homes or taken lodgings for the season. The internationally reknowned photographer, Olive Edis, who had her studio in Sheringham and was not just famous for her portraits of local fishermen and local people, but also photographic portraits of celebrities and Royalty. Amongst those who visited and stayed in the town were Captain Robert Scott, Ernest Shakleton, Arthur Conan Doyle, Vaughan Williams, Albert Einstein, together with politicians, literary figures and the celebrities of the first two decades of the 20th century.

Much more can be found out about those people who came to stay and live in the town through the displays and special exhibitions that feature in Sheringham Museum.


Today Sheringham is known as the Premier Seaside Town on the North Norfolk Coast with 1000s of people flocking here to holiday during the year. Often car parking places are at a premium. Alas the main line railway closed in the 1960s as part of the Beeching report hit the future of many rural lines and stations. Today part of the line is run as a heritage steam railway by the NNR. This alone attracts 1000s of visitors to the town. The wonderful floral displays that have given Sheringham Britain in Bloom awards, the golden sandy beaches and the extensive walks along the cliffs and through the woods of Sheringham Park and Pretty Corner, together with a nationally acclaimed museum on the sea

front are all great attractions. The museum has been awarded the accolade of 'Hidden Gem' by Visit England!

The fascinating story of Sheringham can't be done justice to in these few introductory words. For those of you who want to find out more please visit Sheringham Museum – Open from March to the end of October, Monday to Saturday from 10am – 4.30pm.

Sheringham is a unique place with a very special atmosphere. Residents and visitors alike make the most of the variety of shops and attractions and the friendly welcome that always awaits one and all.

Sheringham Museum is proof that 'from a small acorn a mighty oak may grow!' It is now over 30 years since enthusiasts for the town's history sat round the table in the council chamber laying the first seeds for the development of a museum in Sheringham. Following a popular Family History Day at St.Andrews Methodist Church in 1988, highlighting the history of fishing families and others, a discussion started about how the many facets of the town's history could be collected and put on permanent display.

From the early days in the late 1980s and early 1990s, to the collecting of lifeboats and the growth of the museum to the present site on the East Promenade, None of the development would have been possible without the backing of the Heritage Lottery Fund and the Arts Council. We are also incredibly fortunate to have the backing of our Patrons, Town Council and the independent museum community. Thanks to enthusiasm, expertise and a desire to succeed, Sheringham, in 2023, has a Museum that they should be rightly proud of and one that has a growing reputation nationally.

The Museum possesses at the Mo site four of Sheringham's

lifeboats spanning over 120 years of heroic service. It is the only place in the world where you will find such a collection of lifeboats that served a town.

The Museum is a "Place for People & Boats". Through well developed exhibitions over three floors the story of Sheringham is told. The Mammoth, standing on the balcony overlooking the area where they were once a common sight, tells of the early history together with a well organised fossil record. The replica shops and the story of the rapid development following the coming of the railway in 1887, tell of fishermen developing into early entrepreneurs together with a growth in population as Sheringham establishes itself as a popular seaside holiday destination. Knitted Ganseys and the traditions behind them are celebrated by permanent collections.

Brilliant online education resources have established a popularity amongst schools to visit throughout the year.

From the smart Victorian seaside resort of Sheringham to the Georgian town of Holt, the North Norfolk Railway runs through the county's most stunning coastal scenery.

Operated almost entirely by volunteers from all walks of life, the line, known as the Poppy Line, is East Anglia's premier heritage railway. Operating a varied timetable, passengers can take a journey back in time relaxing in carriages from times gone by whilst Steam and Diesel locomotives take the strain.

The railway's headquarters in Sheringham is more than just a station. There is The Old Luggage Office Refreshment Room where you can indulge in popular all-day breakfasts made with local produce or top up on tea and handmade cakes, a well-stocked souvenir shop as well as an attractive booking hall and a ladies' waiting room making for great photo opportunities. The station is ideally situated for those

wishing to take a stroll through the town and walk along the promenade before joining your train.

Other stations include Weybourne where you can enjoy a cuppa, a picnic or a stroll in the woods or down to the sea and Holt, the western terminus just a mile from the lovely market town centre. Situated at Holt Station, the William Marriott Museum, houses many artefacts, documents and other bygones from the age of steam in East Anglia.

The Railway holds many special events throughout the year including the 1940s weekend, Norfolk Lights Express and Santa Specials. There are also a range of special dining train experiences including cream teas, fish and chips and even gin trains!



with Sheringham Academy and Sheringham Primary School, allowing us to work together and facilitate inclusion. Our pupils come from a wide geographical area of Norfolk,





Sheringham - and the stunning North Norfolk coastline - has, for centuries, provided both a home and inspiration to artists thanks to its big skies and picture-perfect beaches.

Today, Sheringham is still home to many artists and their studios as can be seen on the Norfolk Open Studios trail each year. Local galleries specialise in both local and national art. Art lovers should head to the seafront to view the impressive Sheringham Art & Sculpture Trail which has transformed the barren areas of the concrete sea defence.

The town's Peter Coke Shell Gallery is home to almost 200 colourful, delicate and stunningly realistic sculptures made with shells from all over the world. Peter Coke, actor and playwright, famous for his role as Paul Temple in the

radio series, took the Victorian art of shell craft to new heights of inventiveness, sophistication and variety.

Theatre lovers should head to the Sheringham Little
Theatre in the heart of the town. Boasting the smallest
stage of any professional theatre in the UK, it offers a

History

In the 1800's Sheringham was a small fishing village and its population relied on the sea for their livelihood. At that time *Lower Sheringham*, where the fishermen lived, was a small fishing village with only a few cottages and fish curing houses; cod or lobster were the main catch, according to season. The *Upcher family* encouraged the fishing industry and supplied the first lifeboat named Augusta in 1838. The first RNLI Lifeboat arrived at Sheringham in 1867 and since that time there have been a further 11 RNLI lifeboats stationed in the town.

Following a comprehensive review of the lifeboat cover, it was determined there was a definite need for one of the new breed of the fast inshore 'Atlantic' lifeboats to be stationed on the east coast. Thus in 1994 the first Atlantic

75 (B702) Lifeboat to be placed on active service was stationed at Sheringham and named 'The Manchester Unity of Oddfellows' after the Independent Order of Oddfellows, who bought her for the station. In 2007, the new Atlantic 85 (B818) The Oddfellows also financed by the Independent Order of Oddfellows was placed on station and is the current Lifeboat.

Sheringham Coastguard Rescue Team is one of over 300 similar teams based around the coast of the UK. The team are all volunteers who give their time to train for and respond to coastal emergencies. They are the local face of the HM Coastguard search and rescue operation.

Like the police, fire and ambulance, the coastguard is an emergency service with the same 999 number. Call 999

the incident is and when it happened. While this is going on, alerts will be going off in houses across Sheringham and the surrounding villages as the team are tasked to the incident.

Chris, Jackie, Ian, Allison and Mark will be grabbing helmets, boots and kit bags, and heading to the Fire Station in Sheringham where the team is based. They can

be called out to any type of coastal emergency from people needing rescuing from the water or medical emergencies, unexploded wartime ordnance or dogs gone over cliffs, to dolphins, porpoises and whales.

The team trains throughout the year to ensure they are ready for whatever the next call-out brings.

The north Norfolk coast is a beautiful place to visit in the summertime, its numerous beaches being one of the main attractions. RNLI lifeguards patrol on six beaches in the area during the summer months, keeping them safe for locals and tourists alike. Sheringham has two beaches patrolled by the lifeguards. Sheringham West is patrolled May-Sept by three lifeguards. Sheringham East is patrolled July-Sept by two lifeguards. During these periods beaches are patrolled between 10am and 6pm, seven days a week.

If you are planning a day out at the seaside, it is important to remember to always swim at a lifeguarded beach. The lifeguards will operate a flag system to keep all water users safe:

Red and Yellow flags: These flags will be raised to indicate the safest area to swim. Make sure you always stay in between the red and yellow flags when swimming or bodyboarding, where the lifeguards can see you.

Black and White Flags: The black and white flags indicate the zone for surf craft. If you are surfing or kayaking, stay between the black and white flags.

Red Flag: If this flag is raised at the lifeguard hut or on the beach it means NO SWIMMING. It is unsafe to enter the water if the red flag is flying.

Orange Windsock: This means that there are strong winds blowing out to sea, and that it is not safe to use inflatables. Do not take inflatables into the water if the windsock is flying.

If you are going swimming or surfing in the sea this summer, make sure you always go with a friend. If you should find yourself in trouble or out of depth, raise your hand in the air, shout for help and wait for a lifeguard to come to your assistance. If you have a bodyboard, surfboard or inflatable, do not let go of it as it is keeping you afloat.

When you get to the beach, go and speak to the lifeguards and ask them about the tides, weather forecast and the best times for you to swim safely. They are very friendly and are happy to help! Emergency only calls for lifeboat assistance should be made by dialling 999 and asking for 'Coastguard'.




